- Day 1 will play down to a final table of 9 players or to the competition of Level 16. Tournament directions discretion will apply.
- A single ante will be paid from the big blind for each hand. The ante is paid after the big blind. The ante will not be calculated in the pot pre flop. The ante will not reduce.
- On-Site Registration and Re-Entries are available until the start of Level 9 of this event. Approximately 7:30PM.
- An eliminated player may Re-Enter the event. Alternates and late sign-ups will enter the tournament with a full chip stack and no obligation from it.
- Seating may be limited for this event.
- TDA rules apply. Tournament Director's decisions are final.
- Management reserves the right to alter, change, or cancel this tournament. Management will not be held responsible in the event of typographical errors or misinformation on the website or printed material pertaining to this event.
- This event will be played 8 handed.
- Redraw at 24, and 9 players or at Tournament Director's discretion.
- 12.5% will be "In the Money." Winners will be paid in casino chips.
- All tax laws foreign and domestic apply. Winners must show a valid ID to collect winnings. Residents of foreign countries without a U.S. tax treaty will be subject to withholding. Pursuant to new IRS regulations, W-2G or 1042 forms will be issued for all tournament winnings of \$5,000 or more (net of buy-in amount).
- \$425 will go to the prize pool. \$75 will go toward administrative fee. Administrative fee includes all staffing/dealer fees, and rake.
